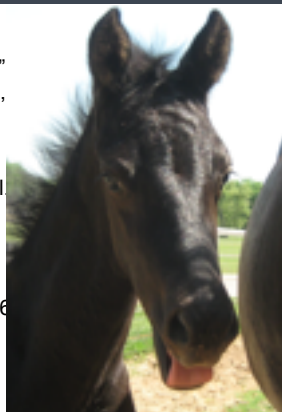


New Arrivals

C&C Colt Company Training/Health Tips

Q: Do you have any advice on blanketing?

Winter is coming quickly! Make sure your horse is ready and comfortable with being blanketed to save you time and stress once the cold weather hits. Start now by introducing your horse to the blanket. Let them sniff and feel it. Then slowly put the blanket on and off the horse's back until they are comfortable. Once they're comfortable with it on their backs you can start doing up the buckles. Start with the straps on the back and work your way forward.

Q: What can you suggest for my horse's digestive health?

Starting your horse on a regimen of ProBios can greatly help with gut problems. All animals need "good" bacteria in their digestive system. Certain conditions (stress, travel, antibiotics etc) can disrupt this balance. Using ProBios can help restore the balance and improve digestive health. Charcoal pills can also help absorb excess gas and hopefully reduce your horses bloat.
